

School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply. This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance.

What has your child been learning about in class this week?

Years 1 & 2

This week it was the turn of Apple class to use the Beebots. We have been creating algorithms for the Beebot and debugging the algorithm if it ended up in the wrong place! We have also been creating some fantastic artwork, inspired by the artist Wassily Kandinsky. We have mixed primary colours to create our own Kandinsky trees. In maths, Cherry class have been learning about the place value in 3-digit numbers and then using this knowledge to compare them. Apple and Elm have continued to add and subtract two-digit and one-digit numbers. In writing lessons, we have been writing and performing our own poems about our theme "Enchanted Woodland".

Years 3 & 4

In Years 3 & 4 this week, we have finished off our American Road Trip Theme with a focus on one of the most famous artists in the world and also an American - Jackson Pollack. The children have learned new skills such as creating a 'wash' as a background and then after studying some of the artist's work, we have created our own Pollack style paintings. The results are amazing and we shall proudly display them in school. You will get to see them at the end of term as the children take them home. We cannot believe we only have one term left before the end of the school year. Next term we shall be learning all about the Ancient Greeks - please see the homework in the purple books.

Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week finished their class text 'Darwin's Dragons', it is a new book we have tried this year and we have thoroughly enjoyed it. In writing, we have written a letter from a character in our book to Queen Victoria using formal vocabulary and also written a detailed description of the Galapagos Giant Tortoise. In maths, we have continued to draw and measure angles accurately and calculate angles on a straight line, around a point and within a triangle.

Within theme lessons we looked at the theories of Darwin and Mendel and then investigated plant growth on our school grounds and considered environmental factors that may affect this growth.

We would like to wish you all a good half term break and hope everyone comes back recharged, ready for our new theme titled 'Tomorrows World'.
