Years 1 & 2

In KS1 the children have begun looking at leaflets and how they are made. We have looked at the features and have created our own leaflets about Tudor houses. In maths, Year 2 children have been making links between multiplication and division and writing our own calculations. Year 1 have been learning about doubling to find near doubles and understanding that the equals sign means the same as and using a balance (scale) to do this.

In our theme we have continued working on aerial views and our local area.

We have also learned how various sea creatures adapt to their habitats and how different animals breathe differently depending on where they live.

In our PE we have been practising 3 important football skills - passing, dribbling and shooting. It has been great to see the children enthused in this subject.



Changes to menu


There will be no roast pork on the menu for the time being due to supplier problems. Roast dinners will alternate between chicken and turkey for the time being. Thank you.

Theme because I like all the aspects of theme – especially Geography!


- 5. What house team are you in?
