Year Group Updates

Nursery & Reception

This week Reception's theme has been 'Day and Night'. The children have been learning all about nocturnal animals and have been talking about their own bedtime routines. They have enjoyed making a collage owl, writing about bedtime routines, naming nocturnal animals, putting the correct amount of spikes on numbered hedgehogs using pegs, making patterns on foil using paints, making their own shadow puppets for the puppet theatre and making simple words using magnetic letters.

Year 1 & 2

The children in Year 1 and 2 been learning about the Life of Grace Darling, a famous person from the past.

If you ask your child they should be able to tell you some facts about her life and her heroic rescue.

They have also continued to write Pirate stories, improving their work by adding extra detail.

In Maths, Year 2 have been working with the fractions 1/2, 1/4, 1/3, whilst Year 1 have been learning about length.

Year 3 & 4

Year 3/4 have enjoyed finding out all about Viking Longships.

The children are learning about writing information texts and how to put their writing into the correct order.

We have also been building Anglo Saxon huts and painting them appropriate colours.

The children have loved learning all about life in 1200 years ago!

We have had a real challenge in Maths as we have focused on arithmetic skills for 1 day a week e.g. lots of sums using + - x ÷

Year 5

This week Year 5 have been making electrical circuits in Science lessons. They worked out how to light a bulb in a simple circuit and then added a switch. They then used this knowledge to make their own torches. We were lucky enough to go to a science morning at The Friary on Thursday too. This was a space themed science morning where the children had great fun at the same time as learning. They were really well behaved and a credit to the school too.

English lessons this week have been grammar themed and in Maths they have been learning the 'bus stop' method for division.

Year 6

We have had a wonderful and exciting start to our Child's War Theme.

So far we have: cooked a WW2 Recipe at home; cooked and tasted WW2 recipes at school; had two visitors who shared their experiences about WW2, bringing with them a wide variety of artefacts and designed an Anderson Shelter. We have also sung in front of an audience at the Cathedral.

We are looking forward to building our Anderson Shelter; finding out facts about WW2 and taking part in the British Cycling Go Ride Initiative in the coming weeks.

Could we please remind parents that PE kits are required on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and ask that children wear shoes and not trainers for school, thank you.
